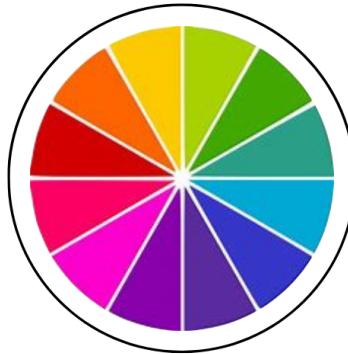


Personal Conceptual Framework for Educational Equity
